MSc / PgDip / PgCert in Health, Safety and Environmental Management

Introduction

This flexible programme allows delegates to choose a qualification that is most appropriate for their needs, i.e. the PgCert, PgDip or MSc.

After completing the Woodland Grange/Oxford Brookes University Diploma in Health & Safety Management, or NEBOSH National Diploma in Occupational Health & Safety (or Level 6 equivalent qualification*), delegates can choose to obtain a MSc in stages.

PgCert

The Post Graduate Certificate (PgCert) in Health, Safety & Environmental Management consists of two modules. Module 1 is 6 days, Module 2 is 5 days.

PgDip

Delegates can then opt to take a further three 5 day modules to obtain a Post Graduate Diploma (PgDip) in HS&E Management. The PgDip will meet the entry requirements into IEMA at Associate level (AIEMA)

MSc

After completion of the PgDip delegates can opt to undertake a dissertation based on any HS&E topic, in order to achieve the MSc in H,S&E Management. The dissertation is supervised by Oxford Brookes University.

All assessments are assignment and project based.

APL (accredited prior learning) may be awarded against the PgDip for those who hold the IEMA Certificate in Environmental Management, the NEBOSH Diploma in Environmental Management or the IEMA Diploma in Environmental Management. Details on request.

* Further assessments may be required for holders of NVQ qualifications.

PgCert in H, S and E Management

The aim of the PgCert is to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to manage environmental issues within organisations.

The PgCert consists of two modules - Environmental Management & Environmental Technology.

MSc / PgDip / PgCert in Health, Safety and Environmental Management

Programme outline

PgDip

The aim of the PgDip stage is to review and evaluate current techniques of health, safety and environmental management and to develop the necessary skills to enable relevant techniques to be applied at strategic and other levels within organisations. The PgDip delegates will undertake a further four taught modular units, structured as three five day modules.

Delegates must complete modules 1 and 2 as part of the 6 module PgDip programme.

Programme outline

MSc

After successful completion of the PgDip delegates can opt to undertake a dissertation on a HSE topic. This consists of an individual research study on a selected topic in Health Safety and Environmental Management.

An introduction to topic selection and the carrying out of work on the dissertation is provided in Research Methods module. In addition, progress is monitored by the module leader.

The topic is chosen by the student and approved by the supervisor and the programme leader. Each student has an individual supervisor. Topics can be related to H,S&E issues or interdisciplinary. A dissertation will normally consist of 15,000 words.

The dissertation allows a student to deepen knowledge and understanding of a concept or problem in the area of health safety and environmental management producing an extended individual study. The student develops independence of critical analysis and synthesis.

MSc / PgDip / PgCert in Health, Safety and Environmental Management

Accredited Prior Learning (APL) Procedure

1 Compulsory APL

The MSc/PgDip/PgCert programme requires 20 M credits of APL in Health and Safety. This is normally the Woodland Grange/Oxford Brookes Diploma in Health & Safety Management or the NEBOSH National Diplomas or equivalent. These Diploma courses or equivalent are also the entry requirements onto the MSc/PgDip/ PgCert programme. Please contact the Woodland Grange Registry for more information on equivalent entry qualifications.

2 Other APL options

Additional APL may be granted for other modules on the PgDip programme. In particular the IEMA Certificate in Environmental Management and the NEBOSH Diploma in Environmental Management will count towards APL as long as the requirements in paras 3 or 4 below are completed.

3 Additional requirements for the granting of APL for the PgDip, re holders of the IEMA Certificate in Environmental Management

3.1 Attend a two-day briefing session at Woodland Grange. This will normally take place on the first day of the Environmental Management module.

The session will include:

- course introduction
- referencing requirements for assignments
- briefing of directed study
- briefing of assessments
- outline of Woodland Grange and Oxford Brookes resources
- initial briefing for the MSc dissertation (for those delegates proposing to progress onto the MSc)

3.2 Complete two directed study exercises. These are 2 x 1500 word essays on the following topics:

- Environmental Monitoring
- Risk Assessment techniques

3.3 Complete 2 x 3000 word assignments on:

- 1 Evaluation of performance measurement methods
- 2 Options for the management of waste within organisations

These are the same assignments completed by candidates attending Module 1 (Environmental Management) and Module 2 (Environmental Technology).

Accredited Prior Learning (APL) Procedure

4 Additional requirements for the granting of APL for the PgDip, re NEBOSH Diploma in Environmental Management

As for the IEMA Certificate (paragraph 3 above) EXCEPT that there are no directed study requirements as detailed in para 3.2.

5 Candidates holding other Environmental Qualifications and claiming APL for the PgDip

Other environmental qualifications will be assessed for equivalence and granted at the discretion of the Programme Manager and Oxford Brookes University.

6 Candidates claiming other APL re the PgDip Modules

APL will only be granted for other PgDip Modules under exceptional circumstances (eg the applicant possesses a recently awarded degree in behavioural safety management). APL is granted at the discretion of the Programme Manager and Oxford Brookes University.

NB: No more than two-thirds of the PgCert (60 M units) or the PgDip (120 M units) or the MSc (180 M units) can be granted as APL. Therefore candidates with the compulsory APL (eg Woodland Grange/Oxford Brookes Diploma in Health & Safety Management) and who are credited APL against Module 1 Environmental Management and Module 2 Environmental Technology will not be eligible for the PgCert should they fail to successfully complete the PgDip.

7 APL evidence

Claims for APL against any of the PgDip modules must be accompanied by copies of Diplomas/Certificates and documented evidence of the course syllabus and assessment criteria.

A copy of the Certificate/Diploma will be acceptable for the IEMA Certificate in Environmental Management or NEBOSH Diploma in Environmental Management, ie no need to provide information on the syllabus/assessment criteria.

Guidance Notes on Completing the Application Form

1 Background and Programme Details

Woodland Grange in collaboration with Oxford Brookes University deliver a modular MSc/PgDip/PgCert course in Health, Safety and Environmental Management.

The taught part of the programme can be completed within 12 months (6 months for the PgCert and 6 months for the PgDip) or the course can be spread over a longer time period. The Master of Science award (MSc) requires completion of a dissertation which provides an opportunity to research a selected aspect of health safety and environmental management into greater depth. The PgCert & PgDip can be taken as standalone programmes but these must be in succession. Individual modules can also be taken as a standalone unit (eg for health, safety and environmental advisers requiring continuing professional development (CPD)). Students may enrol separately for the PgCert, PgDip, MSc or for individual modules.

Please indicate on the form whether you intend to complete the whole MSc programme, the PgDip, PgCert or a standalone module.

Please attach three passport photographs. These will be used for the Oxford Brookes University identity card. The identity card will allow access to University facilities including the library and associated data bases.

Studying at Master's level

Students joining the course with a Woodland Grange/Oxford Brookes Diploma in Health, Safety & Environmental Management or NEBOSH Diplomas should expect a different style of study at Master's level. Students are expected to work much more on their own and research around the topic areas. Set assignments will need to be carefully referenced using the Harvard System.

The modules require mandatory evening work and those students travelling every day should take this into account.

Some of the assessed assignments will require individual presentations and group work.

Internet connected lap tops are made available for use at Woodland Grange. Students will need use of laptop/PC with internet access when not at Woodland Grange.
